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
Activities

- A. Management of the End-users and Stakeholders Platform (ESP)
 - Define platform mechanisms and working guidelines
 - Enroll new members and regularly maintain the SP members updated
 - Act as a hub for receiving specific requests/feedback from partners, involving the right partners to satisfy the needs of the project
- B. Establish and maintain relationships with existing networks and knowledge communities
 - to expand the "stakeholder pool" supporting PANACEA, also leveraging the content the "pool" can bring
 - to create a destination for the dissemination activities
- C. Management of the **Open Calls**
 - Ensure relevant and varied participation from the stakeholders to the open calls
 - Management of the related procurement process, using the budget pre-allocated for this purpose

Output:

• Feedback on scenarios scoping, use cases definition and requirements






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WHAT is the End-users and Stakeholders Platform (ESP) and HOW it is included in the project?





WHO are the end-users and the stakeholders of PANACEA?

PANACEA specifically targets a total of **8 stakeholder** groups:

- Hospitals (users) and patients
- Industry and research
- Policy makers and SDOs





WHAT they are suppose to do with respect to PANACEA?

- Advisory role: provision of user needs, advices to the project partners regarding users requirements, dissemination or networks the ESP member is in contact with.
 - Participation to project workshops assessing, commenting and supplementing interim findings and final results of the project
- Validation role: acting as independent validator of the project solution, providing feedbacks on the usability of the demonstrated technologies for the purpose of an operational use.
 - ESP member can be involved or can eventually host a piloting action



HOW to have a secure yet resourceful exchange of information?

 All SP members will sign an NDA with the project coordination to secure the project information are kept confidential or restricted and will not be widespread





HOW to involve them?

Three levels of involvement:


- \circ INFORM via newsletters, updates, etc.
